Wrexham Centre of Mission is a partnership between the Diocese of St. Asaph, the Wrexham Parochial Education Foundation and Church Army. Wrexham Centre of Mission is based on the Caia Park Estate, an area with issues around child poverty, low social mobility and drugs.

The work of the Wrexham Centre of Mission includes working with young people through the Tin Can Youth Centre and leading Tin Can Youth Church, working in the local schools, a number of football projects to reach out to men and organising hot meals during school holidays for families and individuals struggling.

The last few months have been a really encouraging time for the Centre of Mission. We've started a couple of new initiatives, restarted our Youth Church Service and seen steady growth and attendance in everything we've been doing.



Running Club

In November Jack set up the Tin Can Running Club in partnership with the BCU Health Improvement Team, who are a great and knowledgeable asset. This was in response to a lot of young people saying they wished they had a group where they could stay physically fit. The group mainly focuses on running, but is also hoping to help with mental health and healthy living. It has been fairly well attended so far but we're hoping it will get busier in the spring months. Jack is hoping this will turn into another platform where he can share the gospel message and also engage meaningfully with the local community.

There were people from all ages along and it was great to link in with so many people from the community.

In December we collaborated on a Christmas fair at St Mark's. This was the first one of these, at least for a number of years. There was a mixture of crafts, fair games, face painting, live Christmas music, prayer spaces & refreshments. This wasn't quite as well attended but great to welcome people from the community in to the church building and a particular highlight was that a number of young people from the Tin Can came along to help run some of the activities.

The gardening mentoring sessions Josh & Jack have been doing in Hafod Y Wern school have been going really well. There is a group of seven children who each week come and spend time with Josh & Jack in the garden. The activities have included weeding out much of the garden, planting vegetables & bulbs, dismantling and rebuilding a bug hotel & cooking garlic bread in an underground makeshift oven. The children are really enjoying this time and it's great to see them all coming out of their shells each week.

At the start of December Josh & Jack delivered a week of assemblies in Rhosnesni High school (Well Josh actually only did the Monday as Joanie was born that evening!) These went really well and it is an amazing answer to prayer for us as a the Tin Can works so much better when we are active within this school as it is right next door. Please pray for more opportunities like this for Josh & Jack to work with and support Rhosnesni High School.

In November we ran our first social which was a FIFA tournament on PlayStation at Hope Street Church, our partners in this project. This was a great time of being able to chat to some of the lads a lot more than you get to on



a Wednesday at football. We're hoping to do more of these socials in the new year and praying for the relationships we're building to get to a stage where the lads want to chat about God and faith. Please join us in praying that some of these lads will be interested in faith and want to go on an alpha course this year.

Tin Can

In September we have reopened the after school drop in at Tin Can. This has been great to welcome in some new young people we have not met before. These have been steadily growing but after we did the assemblies in Rhosnesni we had loads of new faces. We are hopeful that these sessions will continue to grow and this new generation of young people will make Tin Can their home.

We restarted Youth Church in September and had more young people come to that meeting than had gone to any of the previous Youth Church sessions we did back in 2019. This was a



huge encouragement to us to see the young people wanting to engage in a session like this. Since then we've met monthly as a Youth Church with a steady core of young people who are there each week. We've had some amazing speakers down who have been really challenging to the young people and we're really encouraged at how it's going. Please pray for the young people as they engage with faith monthly, that God will be revealing Himself more and more to them and that they'll be able to grow deeper and deeper into relationship with Him.

We hope this will continue to grow into a great way to engage with and get to know the young people in the College

Since our last newsletter Josh has been able to go back in to Wrexham FC one day a week. This has been great as this year the club really wants Josh to be active in all areas of the football club. On his first one back he was shown round and introduced to all the members of staff as well as the players and coaches. This is probably the most welcoming the club has been during Josh's time as chaplain and Josh is really enjoying the new dynamic.
