Types of legacy gifts

What types of gifts can you leave to Church Army in your Will?


- An affordable cash gift (Pecuniary gift)
 - This is a gift of a specific amount. Please remember that even a generous gift of £2,000 today will devalue over time due to inflation so you may want to review and update this gift periodically to maintain its value.
- 1-100% of your residual estate (Residuary gift)
 - This means a share of your estate, once you have taken care of your loved ones and left them what you wish. You can leave any share to Church Army from 1% - 100% depending upon your personal circumstances and wishes. Even a small percentage could make a huge difference to those we serve. as a residuary gift should retain its' value over time.
- A specific item
 - · You can leave specific items such as jewellery, property, or shares to Church Army. For gifts of shares or contributions from your pension, we recommend consulting a professional advisor.

Dedicated to helping others to know the love of God, Len Gray left a gift to Church Army in his Will.

Len sadly passed away at the age of 90 after a rich and diverse life, marked by a strong commitment to his Christian faith. His journey began in Shipley, West Yorkshire in 1931, but the family later moved to the small village of Hempstead, near

> Saffron Walden. He excelled at Newport (Essex) Grammar School where he went on to be head boy. From a

> > were his guiding light, nurtured in the 1940s through evangelical churches, shaping his core values. He began a career in teaching after attending training college, and married Louise in 1954. They settled in Harrow where they lived for the rest of their lives.



Upon retiring, Len dedicated himself to training as a Reader in the Church of England, and he became familiar with the profound work of the Church Army. This experience deepened his understanding and fervour for Church Army's evangelical mission, focused on transforming lives through initiatives in poverty relief, outreach, and social impact. In a testament to his unwavering commitment, Len chose to include a generous gift for Church Army in his Will, ensuring that many more lives would be touched by the mission to spread God's love through words and action. Len's bequest stands as a lasting legacy, demonstrating his dedication to uplifting others through Christian principles. Thanks to his heartfelt gesture, many more people will now benefit from the vital work of Church Army.

How to leave a legacy gift

Creating a Will might seem daunting, but here are the basic steps to ensure your wishes are honoured and your loved ones are cared for:

1. List Your Assets

· Consider what assets you own and make a comprehensive list.

2. Identify Beneficiaries

Decide which loved ones and organisations you want to include in your Will.
 You can leave any type of gift to any person or organisation, as outlined on page.....

3. Choose Executors

Select the person or persons who will act as your executor(s). An executor
ensures your wishes are carried out and can be a friend, family member, legal
representative, or a combination.

4. Consult a Solicitor

We recommend seeking qualified legal advice when making a Will. A
properly written Will clarifies your intentions and protects those close to you
from dealing with complex challenges later. Church Army has partnered with
the National Free Wills Network (NFWN) to offer a professionally written Will
or update an existing Will at no cost to you. See page 11 for more details.

5. Consider Including Church Army

 While there is no obligation, we hope you will consider including a gift to Church Army in your Will. Provide your professional Will writer with our official name and registered charity number: Church Army, registered charity 226226 (England & Wales), SC04057 (Scotland), and 20152604 (the Republic of Ireland).

6. Inform Us of Your Plans

• Letting us know about your planned gift helps us plan for the future and recognize your generosity.

7. Store Your Will Safely

• Keep your Will in a safe place and inform your executor(s) of its location.



From an early age, Joyce Hewitt felt called to show the love of God to others around her and this compassion lives on through her legacy gift to the work of Church Army. Joyce, from Doncaster, was a dedicated Sunday School teacher at just 14, and always embodied Christian values. Joyce held Church Army in high regard throughout her life, fondly recalling the positive impact Church Army members had on her formative years.

Joyce became known as the culinary master behind the school dinners at Doncaster Grammar School in the late 1940s and her culinary journey earned her the MBE from Queen Elizabeth II for her contributions to catering. At 61, Joyce pioneered coffee mornings at St James Church, later transforming them into a vibrant Luncheon Club that united locals, combating loneliness and homelessness, a testament to her passion for community service.

Sadly, Joyce passed away in December 2022, aged 98, but her legacy lives on as she generously left a large part of her estate to Church Army, ensuring her spirit of compassion and love for community to continue. Joyce's kind-hearted gift will allow Church Army to continue working in communities, reaching those who may not otherwise feel God's love and showing the kindness that Joyce so clearly demonstrated throughout her life.

Joyce's incredible generosity will continue to support some of our Centres of Mission who have provided 33,400 food parcels or meals in the past year. The impact of her dedication to sharing love through food continues to

Through our partnership with the National Free Wills Network, we offer a free, noobligation service to help you write a simple Will or update an existing one. They connect you with local experienced solicitors who guide you through the process at no cost to you.

Simply:

1. Contact Church Army

• Fill out the form overleaf and return it in the provided envelope, or email the form to legacy@churcharmy.org

2. Choose a Local Solicitor

• The Network connects you with participating solicitors in your area who specialize in writing Wills and explain how to make an appointment.

3. Will Writing Appointment

• Discuss your wishes with your solicitor, who will guide you through the process and create your Will.

4. Optional Gift to Church Army

• There is no obligation, but we hope you will consider leaving a gift to Church Army.

Why Do I Need A Will?

A Will is one of the most important documents that you can make throughout your life. Without a Will in the UK, the law determines who inherits your assets, potentially leaving out loved ones or benefiting unintended parties. By drafting a Will, you retain control over your estate, allowing you to allocate your assets to individuals and organizations of your choice. You can also include provisions to minimize Inheritance Tax and maximize the inheritance for your loved ones. Seeking advice from a solicitor can help you make informed decisions that reflect your values and provide peace of mind for you and your family.

Are There Any Tax Savings?

Leaving a gift to a charity in your Will can reduce or even eliminate your Inheritance Tax liability. Gifts to charity are 100% tax-free and are deducted from your estate before tax calculations. Typically, Inheritance Tax is charged at 40% on anything above the £325,000 threshold (Nil Rate Band). However, if you leave 10% of your taxable estate to charity, the Inheritance Tax rate on the rest of your estate reduces from 40% to 36%, allowing your loved ones to maximize their inheritance.

Example Calculation

Estate Value: £600,000 | Nil-Rate Band: £325,000

- · Without a Charitable Gift:
 - Taxable Estate: £600,000 £325,000 = £275,000
 - IHT at 40%: £275,000 x 40% = £110,000
 - Amount for Beneficiaries: £600,000 £110,000 = £490,000
- With a Charitable Gift of £50.000:
 - Taxable Estate: £600,000 £325,000 £50,000 = £225,000
 - IHT at 40%: £225,000 x 40% = £90,000
 - Amount for Beneficiaries: £600,000 £90,000 £50,000 = £460,000
- With a Charitable Gift of £60,000 (more than 10% of the net estate):
 - Taxable Estate: £600,000 £325,000 £60,000 = £215,000
 - IHT at 36%: £215,000 x 36% = £77,400
 - Amount for Beneficiaries: £600,000 £77,400 £60,000 = £462,600

Can I Specify What Church Army Do With My Gift?

While we will make every effort to honour specific gifts in your Will, if you are passionate about a particular project or Centre of Mission, we kindly ask that you consider wording your pledge to allow us to use the gift where the need is greatest at the time. This flexibility enables us to steward your gift in the most efficient way as future needs arise, ensuring your generosity has the maximum impact when the time comes.

Is It Easy to Change My Will?

Yes, changing a Will is relatively straightforward. In the UK, the primary methods for making changes are through a codicil or by creating a new Will.

Codicil

A codicil is a legal document that amends your existing Will. It can be used for minor changes, such as altering a beneficiary, adding a new gift, or changing your executor. The codicil must be signed and witnessed in the same manner as the original Will and should be stored with the original Will, though not physically attached to it.

New Wills

Writing a new Will is often the best option for substantial changes. The new Will should explicitly revoke all previous Wills and codicils.

How often should I review my Will?

It's advisable to review your Will regularly, especially after major life events such as marriage, divorce, the birth of a child, or significant changes in your financial situation. Our partners at the **National Free Wills Network** can help you create a new Will or update an existing one, depending upon your personal circumstances and wishes.
